- I. Roberto Postlethwaite, (CDEM)
 - Welcome remarks.
- II. Mark Baza, Executive Director Imperial County Transportation Commission (ICTC).
 - Overview of the Imperial Mexicali Binational Alliance.
 - ➤ Border infrastructure, Economic Development, and Environmental Issues
 - Miguel Figueroa (ICWDB) gave an update of the New River project. It took approximately 18 months for 17 agencies to identify key issues for AB1079 that impacted both Mexico and the U.S. The U.S. efforts are moving forward with the identified improvements that will address public health and community development surrounding the New River area.
 - Karlo Limon (SIDUE) presented on the previous proposed concept of for realignment of
 the SENTRI and Ready lanes on the East Port of Entry (POE). Based on coordination with
 the U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP), realignment of the lanes was determined
 not feasible due to physical constrains. An additional lane would need to be added to
 provide enough space for Recreational Vehicles/Trailers and buses. Further discussions
 will be held with GSA to look at the opportunity of financing an addition vehicle lane at
 the East POE.
 - Tom E. DuBose (IVEDC) gave an overview of Cali Baja San Diego County /Imperial County/Baja California, Mexico workgroup.
 - Becoming a powerful workgroup by working together
 - Goods movement within the region
 - Jeff Kinsell (KND/Safer Communities)
 - > Update for public private partnership (P3) for funding of the West POE
 - Continued discussion at the congressional level in an effort to create a P3 opportunity
 - Carlos Lopez (SIDUE)
 - Update on the border crossing Mexicali Rio Nuevo
 - 1st Phase of work has been completed
 - ➤ Completion of the POE project is contingent on funding for the U.S. improvements of the Calexico West POE
 - Anthony Kleepe (GSA)
 - Overview of full renovation and expansion of the Calexico West POE and short term pedestrian improvements
 - Seeking funding for Phase I of the renovation/expansion of the Calexico West POE
 - ➤ Estimated construction cost for the Calexico West POE Pedestrian expansion is estimated between 1 to 3 million
 - Mayor Bill Hodge (City of Calexico)
 - Requested that a factsheet for the Alliance be created so that it can be used to promote the expansions of the Calexico LPOEs
